Sage Green

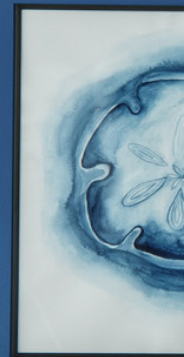

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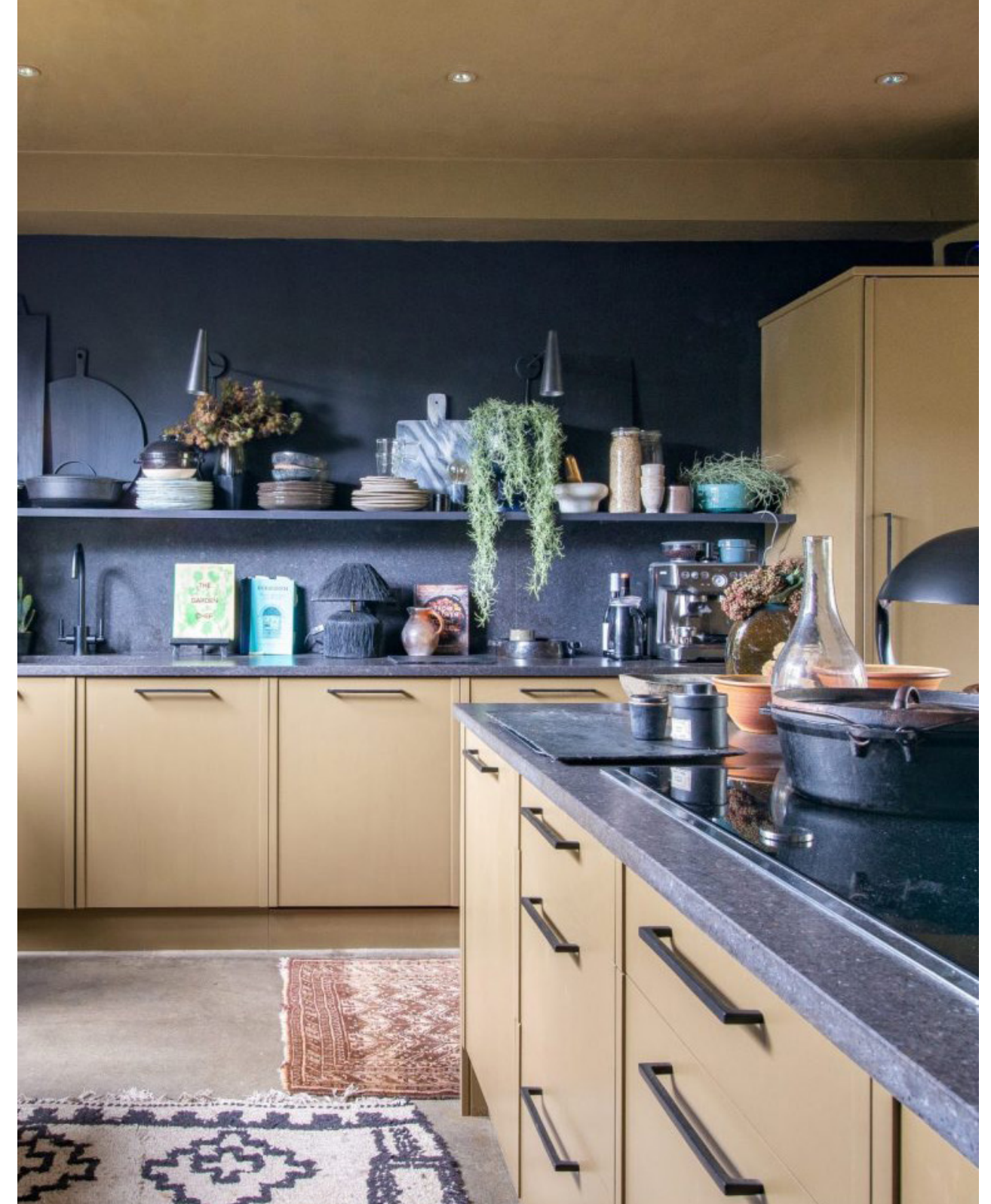
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Consult a kitchen designer

Add pattern and texture

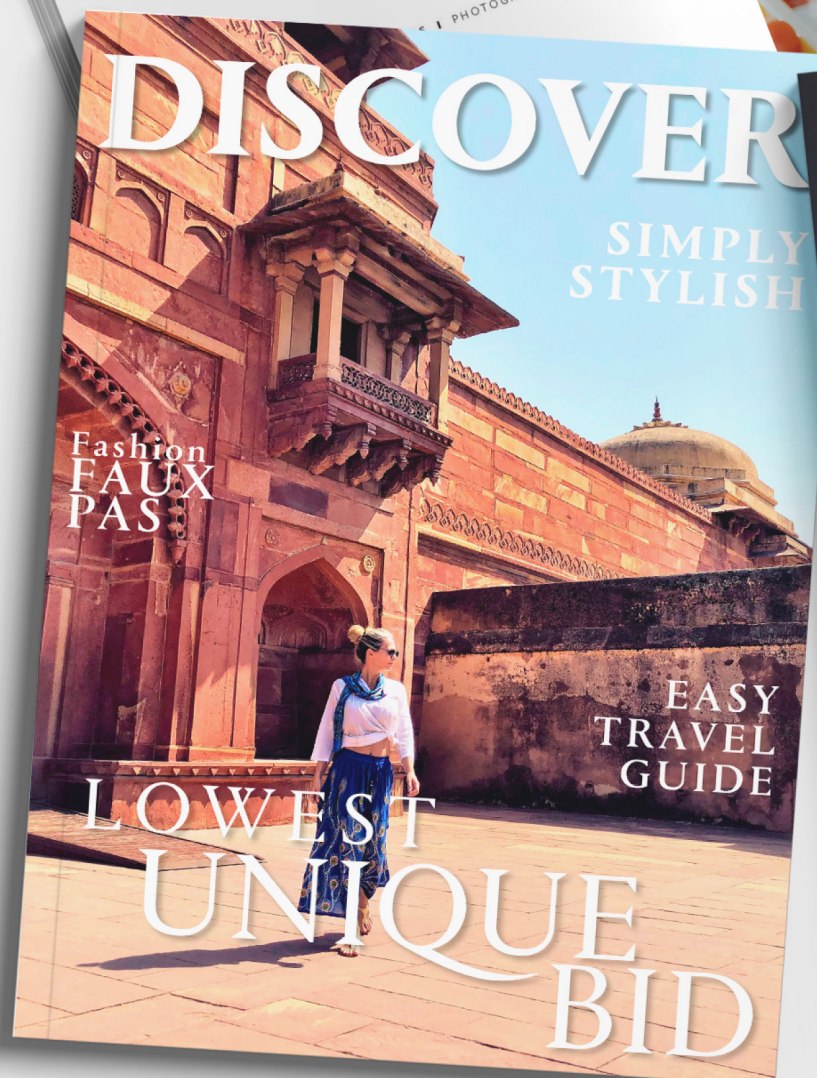
